



16TH TOUR CIBC CHARLES-BRUNEAU: THREE CYCLING ITINERARIES TO FIGHT PEDIATRIC CANCER

TADOUSSAC, JULY 5, 2011 – Shortly after 8:20 am today, the **25 cyclists** taking part in the 16th edition of Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau gathered on Quai Tadoussac for the official start of their 600-km bicycle trek that will take them to **Baie-St-Paul, Québec City, Sorel and Montréal**. This year's Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau runs from **July 5 to 8, 2011** and is intended to raise the funds needed to give **children with cancer** the best chances of recovery. **Pierre Bruneau**, TVA news anchor and spokesman for the Fondation Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau, will join the cyclists for the four-day event, which culminates in their arrival at Montreal's Parc Maisonneuve on Friday, July 8, for the official announcement of the proceeds raised. Under the theme "**Our commitment – stronger than ever!**" the artisans of this major cyclist tour hope to surpass the sum of \$1,650,000 raised last year.

For **Pierre Bruneau**, the growing popularity of the Fondation's cycling event is equalled only by the passion embodied by each of the cyclists: "The Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau is a very important event because it allows the Fondation to take its mission and its message to several cities in Quebec. Seventy percent (70%) of children treated at the Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau come from outside of Montreal, so it's important to get out and meet these families in difficulty in order to support their fight."

Pairing Based on Caring

Thanks to our "pairing based on caring" initiative, children with cancer will have a chance to encourage and inspire our cyclists, since each cyclist will have a photograph of a child with cancer emblazoned on the front of his or her jersey for the duration of the Tour. The cyclists will also have a chance to meet their protégés during the tour.



In conjunction with the 16th edition of the Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau, Pierre Bruneau, spokesperson of the Fondation Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau, is accompanied by actor Paul Doucet, spokesperson of the two-day itinerary, journalist Yvan Martineau and the heroes Félix-Antoine Brin, Léa Sicard and Laurence Chagnon, on July 4, 2011.

"My father will be riding his bicycle for four days to help sick children. Now that I'm doing better, I'll be able to follow him and encourage him," says **8-year-old Félix-Antoine Brin**, who has been named "hero" of the four-day itinerary. The Boucherville native is in remission following treatment for acute lymphoblastic leukemia. Félix-Antoine was diagnosed with cancer at the age of 2. After several rounds of chemotherapy and radiotherapy, he received a bone marrow transplant in September 2007. His health has since improved and he is anxiously awaiting his complete recovery, expected in 2012.

For **Sylvain Vinet**, Senior Vice-President, Distribution, Retail, Eastern Canada, CIBC, being able to contribute to the Tour's success has been a source of collective pride at the **CIBC** since 2006. "In the last five years, CIBC employees and clients have remitted close to \$1.4 million to the Fondation Centre de cancérologie Charles-Bruneau. As a principal partner, *our commitment is stronger than ever*, and we're well aware of the importance of each dollar collected for children with cancer. Again this year, five of our employees will cycle 600 kilometres for little Maya, who's been an example of courage to all of us." 6-year-old Maya Lelièvre is currently in remission following treatment for myeloid leukemia. Her mother, Julie Plante, has worked at the CIBC for four years.

Two-day Itinerary

This morning, actor **Paul Doucet** was on-site to announce that he would be joining the **22 experienced cyclists** to complete the Tour CIBC Charles-Bruneau's two-day itinerary on **July 7 and 8, 2011**. Departing from Sherbrooke, the field of riders will travel to Granby and then Montreal, spanning a distance of almost 300 kilometres in less than 48 hours.

Ambassador's Day

On July 8, the final day of the Tour, some **95 additional cyclists** will join the riders completing the four-day itinerary for the 125-kilometre trek from Sorel to Montreal. Organizers will then gather at Parc Maisonneuve to announce the total proceeds raised by the event. They will be joined by Montreal Mayor **Gérald Tremblay**.
